Mijbil The Otter

Main Points of the Story

- ❖ When Maxwell's dog died. He became alone without a pet.
- ❖ In 1956, he travelled to Southern Iraq and there he thought of keeping an otter instead of a dog.
- ❖ His friend advised him to get an otter in Tigris marshes. They were found in plenty there.
- ❖ Two Arabs were squatting on the floor and a sack was lying beside them
- ❖ They handed him a note from his friend. It read: "Here is your otter ..."
- ❖ The narrator named the otter 'Mijbil'.
- ❖ In the beginning, Mijbil was indifferent but started taking a keen interest in his surroundings.
- ❖ He came to his bed and remained sleep on Maxwell's knees.
- ❖ Like every otter, Mijbil enjoyed splashing water like a hippo.
- ❖ Mijbil was successful in screwing up the tap to its full flow.
- ❖ The otter spent most of his time in playing.
- ❖ It was really a difficult job to transport Mijbil from Basra to England.
- ❖ Mij was packed up in small box.
- ❖ The air hostess was quite friendly and cooperative and suggested keeping the pet on his knee.
- ❖ As the box was opened, Mij was out of the box in flash.
- ❖ Mijbil disappeared and later on it was found beneath the legs of a turbaned Indian.
- ❖ Maxwell remained in London with Mijbil for nearly a month.
- ❖ Mij invented his own game with the ping-pong ball.
- ❖ Like school children he would touch every block with his feet and touch every second lamp-post.
- ❖ The average Londoner could not recognise an otter and people started giving wild guesses about him.
- ❖ Mijbil was called 'a baby seal', 'a squirrel', 'a walrus', 'a beaver', etc.

Read the extract given below and answer the questions that follow:

1. What I casually mentioned this to a friend, he casually replied that I had better get one in the Tigris marshes, for there they were as common as mosquitoes, and were often tamed by the Arabs. We were going to Basra to the Consulate-General we found that my friend's mail had arrived but that mine had not.
- What was 'they'?
 - Where could the author get 'one'?
 - Find the exact word from the extract which means 'domesticated.'
 - What did the author find at the Consulate-General?

Ans. a. 'They' in the extract are Otters.

b. The narrator gets one from the Tigris marshes.

c. 'tamed'.

d. The author found that his mail had not arrived while his friend's mail had arrived.

2. With the ping-pong ball he invented a game of his own which could keep him engrossed for up to half an hour at a time.
- Who is 'he'?
 - Which game did he invent?
 - Find out the word from the paragraph which means 'keenly interested'.

Ans. a. Mijibil, the Otter, is 'he' referred to here.

b. He invented a game of his own which he played with a ping-pong ball. It could keep him engrossed for half an hour.

c. The word is 'engrossed'.

3. Early in the New Year of 1956 I travelled to Southern Iraq. By then it had crossed my mind that I should like to keep an otter instead of a dog, and that Camusfearna, ringed by water a stone's throw from its door, would be an eminently suitable spot for this experiment.
- What 'experiment' did Maxwell think Camusfearna would be suitable for?
 - Why was it a suitable spot for his experiment?
 - Write the meaning of the phrase, 'crossed my mind'.

Ans. a. Maxwell thought that Camusfearna would be suitable for keeping an otter. This was the experiment to keep an otter at a dry place.

- b. It (Camusfearna) was a suitable place for his experiment because it was ringed by otter, a stone's throw from its door.
- c. 'Crossed my mind' means 'came to my mind'.

Short Answer Type Questions

1. What had crossed the author's mind and why? (Or)

Why did Maxwell think of keeping an otter as a pet?

Ans. Maxwell's favourite dog Jonnie died. It left him alone without a pet. He travelled to Southern Iraq in 1956. By then it has crossed his mind that he should like to keep an otter instead of a dog. The place he lived on was ringed by water. It was quite a suitable place for his new experiment.

2. What did his friend advise Maxwell?

Ans. Maxwell had already decided to keep an otter as a pet instead of dog. He casually mentioned it to a friend. He advised Maxwell that he should try to get an otter in the Tigris marshes. Otters were as common there as were mosquitoes. They were often tamed by the Arabs.

3. Why were they going to the consulate-General in Basra? Why did he wait for five days there?

Ans. Maxwell and his companions were going to Basra to the Consulate-General to collect and answer their mail from Europe. He found that his friend's mail had arrived but that his had not. He tried to telephone but didn't get any success. His mail came only after five days.

4. How did Maxwell get Mijbil, the otter?

Ans. Maxwell had changed his idea of keeping a dog as his pet. He decided to have an otter. He had asked one of his friends to arrange for an otter. He went to his bedroom to read his mail. Two Arabs were squatting on the floor. Beside them lay a sack. They handed him a note which said, "Here is your otter ...". The sack was opened. In this way, Maxwell got his new pet-an otter.

5. Describe the physical appearance of Mijbil, the otter.

Ans. The creature that emerged from the sack was unique one. He resembled like a very small imaginary dragon of the Middle Ages. Its body was coated with pointed scales. Between them a soft velvet fur was visible. It was like a chocolate brown mole.

6. Why was Mijbil christened Maxwell's otter?

Ans. The narrator called his pet Mijbil. The otter, in fact, belonged to a race unknown to science so far. It was christened at length by zoologists *Lutrogale Perspicillata maxwelli* or the Maxwell's otter, it was christened after the name of his master.

7. What is a characteristic of otter and how did Mijbil behave in water?

Ans. The main characteristic of an otter is to extend and spread every drop of water about the place. A bowl full of water must be overturned. He would sit in and splash in until it flows.

8. How did Mijbil fumble at the tap in the bathroom. Did he succeed?

Ans. Maxwell saw Mijbil standing up on the end of his bathtub. He was fumbling at the taps with his paws. Very soon he turned the tap to produce a trickle of water. And soon after he achieved the full flow.

9. How would Mijbil play with a rubber-ball, and jiggle with small object and marbles?

Ans. Mijbil spent hours shuffling a rubber ball around the room like a four-footed soccer player. But the real game which mijbil enjoyed most was juggling with small objects with his paws lying on his back. Mijbil's favourite toys for his play were marbles.

10. How was Mijbil transported from Basra to London?

Ans. It was a difficult job for Mijbil to be transported form Basra to London. The British airline wouldn't fly animals. He books a fight to Paris on small box an hour before so that he would become accustomed to it.

11. Why did Maxwell call the airhostess " the very queen of her kind?"

Ans. The airhostess was very friendly and cooperative. Maxwell took her into his confidence and gave her a parcel of fish for mijbil. He admired her and called her " the very queen of her kind". The air hostess suggested that he could keep his pet on his knee.

12. Where did mijbil disappear and how was he found?

Ans. The moment the box was open, mij was out of it flash. He disappeared soon down the aircraft. There were squawks and sheiks. A rat!" Mijbil was found beneath the legs of a

turbaned Indian. Maxwell dived for him but found his face covered in curry. In the end, Mijbil himself came and sat on Maxwell's knee.

13. What game did Mij invent in London?

Ans. Mij played with a ping-pong ball. Due to this game, the author's suitcase was damaged. There was a slope on one end of the suitcase. Mij placed the ball on the high end, then it ran down to the other end. This continued for a long time.

14. What game did Mij invent?

Ans. Mij invented a game of his own with the ping-pong ball which could keep him engrossed for half an hour at a time. He also discovered that if he placed the ball on the high end it would run down the length of the suitcase.

15. What special characteristic of Mijbil did Maxwell learn after he took him to the bathroom?

Ans. When Maxwell took Mijbil to bathroom, he found that it enjoyed there too much because its natural instinct is to play and enjoy in water. It plunged and rolled in bathroom. It itself went to the bathroom and struggled with the taps until the water came out.

16. What guesses did the Londoners make about what Mijbil was?

Ans. The Londoners could not recognize an otter. They tried to guess what the animal was. They thought it to be a baby seal, a squirrel, a walrus, a hippo or a leopard.

17. What compulsive habits had Mijbil developed?

Ans. Compulsive habits indicate those habits that cannot be controlled. In Mijbil's case, he would tug the author to the two feet high wall of a school opposite to his flat, when he walked with him (author). He would also jump on to the wall and run the full length of its thirty yards.

18. What happened when Maxwell took Mijbil to the bathroom? What does it tell us about Mijbil?

Ans. When Maxwell took Mijbil to bathroom, he found that it enjoyed there too much because its natural instinct is to play and enjoy in water. It plunged and rolled in bathroom. It itself went to the bathroom and struggled with the taps until the water came out.

19. Give an example from the text to show that Mijbil is an intelligent animal.

Ans. Once Mijbil was hurt in box, and while opening it whimpered and caught the author by the leg. It played with Ping-Pong balls and enjoyed galloping on the thirty-yard wall in London. All these things show that Mijbil is an intelligent animal.

20. What happened when Maxwell took Mijbil to the bathroom? What did Mijbil do two days after that?

Ans. When Maxwell took Mijbil to the bathroom, it enjoyed there too much. It pinged and rolled in the bath tub. After two days, it went to the bathroom itself and struggled with the tap until there was a full of water.

21. What things does Mij do which tell you that he is an intelligent animal who needs love?

Ans. On the first day, it was aloof and indifferent but on the second day, it entered the author's bed and did not wake up till the servant brought tea. When he was hurt in the box, the author opened it. It whimpered and caught him by the leg. It also played with ping-pong balls, and placed itself on the author's knees. It also enjoyed galloping on the thirty yard wall in London. All these things tell us that Mij is an intelligent animal who needs love.

22. What guesses did the Londoners make about that Mij was?

Long Answer Type Questions

1. Why did Maxwell decide to have an otter as a pet? How did he get it?

Ans. Maxwell's pet dog Jonnie died. He felt alone without a pet. This time he decided to change his pet. He decided to own an otter as his pet. His place, Camusfearna was ringed by water. It would be a suitable place for this new experiment. One of his friends suggested that he could get an otter in the Tigris marshes as were mosquitoes. They were often tamed by the Arabs as pets. Maxwell got his mail after five days. He carried it to his bedroom to read. There he found two Arabs Squatting on the floor. A sack lay beside them, there was something moving and twisting in it. The Arabs handed him a note from his friend. It read, " Here is your otter ..." The sack was opened. And there emerged a unique creature from the sack. Later on, this otter was named Mijbil by Maxwell.

2. Why was Mijbil, the otter christened Maxwell's otter by zoologists? How did the otter behave in the beginning and afterwards?

5. What were strange and funny wild guesses that Londoners made about Mijbil? Who made the best remark about the otter?

Ans. It was rather difficult for an average London to recognise such a strange animal as otter. Most of them had never seen such a unique animal. The thing that surprised Maxwell that Londoners made such funny and wild guesses about Mijbil, the otter. He faced a continuous barrage of question from the anxious but ignorant people. 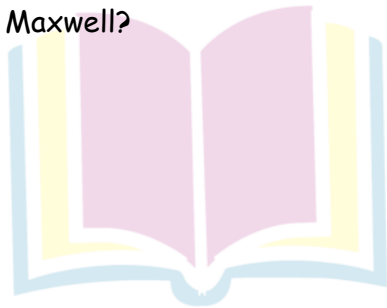
